

## FDIC Course CEU Accreditation by State

Alabama	Alabama doesn't currently require CEUs
Alaska	The State of Alaska only requires CEUs for our highest level of Fire Service Instructor recertification. We will accept CEUs from FDIC for that purpose
Arizona	Arizona does not currently require CEUs
Colorado	In the State of Colorado personnel must have a printed certificate that lists course, dates, and total hours. They then can use this toward their required CE as needed
Connecticut	The CFA/Commission on Fire Prevention & Control does not require nor use CEUs for any level of certification or training. Therefore there is no recognition that can be bestowed
Idaho	Idaho will accept FDIC training hour for hour toward recertification requirements. The course content must be relevant to the current Standard for which recertification is sought. A printed course completion certificate listing course name, date, and total hours must accompany any request for recertification.
Illinois	Illinois does not require CEUs
Iowa	The Iowa Fire Service Training Bureau recommends hour for hour credit (for all FDIC training opportunities) towards the continuing education requirements of the Iowa Firefighter Minimum Training Standard.
Kansas	Continuing education requirement for Associate Instructors. Attendance at FDIC is approved for "Hour for Hour" credit
Kentucky	Subject to approval by the individual firefighter's department, Kentucky will accept FDIC programs, on an hour for hour basis, for training areas identified by the Kentucky Fire Commission. A printed course completion certificate listing course name, date and hours must be submitted to the firefighter's department. Louisiana	Louisiana does not require recertification hours and therefore we do not, as a state, require CEUs
Maryland	Maryland will accept CEUs from the FDIC for Maryland Fire Service Instructor's if approved by the Maryland Instructor Certification Review Board
Massachusetts	Massachusetts does not have a requirement for CEUs
Mississippi	The state of Mississippi currently does not require CEUs
Missouri	The Missouri Division of Fire Safety accepts FDIC training classes (hour for hour) for fire service instructor recertification. Individuals must submit a copy of their attendance certificate(s) when applying for recertification

Montana	Will accept CEUs for "Equivalency" recertification only, provided the content is relevant to the current standard for which recertification is sought. Accredited certification and recertification requires performance testing to the current standard
New Hampshire	NH will observe hour-for-hour credit toward instructor CEUs for the year, which is the only continuing education we require to maintain any certification *EMS CEUs also observed hour-for-hour
North Carolina	North Carolina fire chiefs track CEUs for firefighters and will accept FDIC training
North Dakota	North Dakota does not require CEUs
Northwest Territories, CA	The Northwest Territories do not require CEUs
Nova Scotia, CA	NS does not require CEUs
Oregon	Oregon will allow FDIC training classes (hands-on and classroom) to be used toward fire service certification maintenance
Pennsylvania	Pennsylvania has and will continue to recognize hour for hour FDIC training for our Local Level Instructors to meet their annual professional development requirements
South Carolina	South Carolina does not require CEUs
South Dakota	South Dakota does not require CEUs
Texas	Personnel must have a printed certificate that lists course, dates, and total hours. They then can use this toward their required CE as needed
Vermont	Hour for hour, for our all of our program recertification requirements where applicable, including Fire Instructor annual CEU requirements.
Virginia	No CEUs
Washington	Washington State does not require CEUs
West Virginia	The State of West Virginia does not require CEUs
Wyoming	Does not require CEUs
